This letter is being submitted in accordance with provisions in Schedule 20-930 of Act 10 (HB105) of the 2019 Regular Legislative Session which stipulate "any funds remaining after the completion of any project outlined in R.S. 17:3394.3 may be made available and used for other projects provided within R.S. 17:3394.3 that are for the benefit of the same institution. Prior to the final allocation of such funds, any changes shall first be reported to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget."

While no physical transfer of funds has occurred, on April 9, 2020, the LCTCS Facilities Corporation Board, which is charged with the management of all Act 360 projects, approved the transfer of \$20,000 of funds from the Baton Rouge Community College Automotive Collision Center project to the Acadian Campus Renovation project. Additionally, the LCTCS Board of Supervisors ratified this transfer of funds at its meeting on June 10, 2020.

This transfer will allow for a more complete renovation of the BRCC Acadian Campus facility and allow for the purchase of needed additional training equipment. The availability of these funds was as a result of an unexpected low bid received on the Automotive Collision Training Center project.
