Subject: October Medicaid Report

In accordance with the preamble language to Schedule 09 in HB1 of the 2021 Regular Session, attached please find the October Medicaid report. As required, this report represents the actual Means of Financing and Expenditures for Fiscal Year 2021 and the initial budget allocation by appropriation for Fiscal Year 2022.

As you will note, the report reflects \$52.6M in excess State General Fund for the fiscal year (FY) ending June 2021; this surplus is the result of a delay in the CMS approval of the Department's January 1, 2021 capitation rates for our managed care organizations. A carryforward BA7 totaling \$284M was submitted and approved during the 2021 Regular session to provide the expenditure and financing authority in FY 22 in order to satisfy the FY 21 obligation. LDH anticipates utilizing the carried forward dollars to pay the FY 2021 obligations in FY 2022 upon CMS approval of the Act 421 State Plan Amendment and the 2021 rates.

Beginning in November 2021 and monthly thereafter, each monthly report will provide updated projected expenditures and anticipated revenue collections in the Medicaid program for Fiscal Year 2022.

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Louisiana Medical Vendor Agency Financial Reporting Requirements

Act 119 of the 2021 Regular Legislative Session appropriates revenues and expenditures for the State's Medical Vendor Payments agency at a program level as follows:

Program	Type of Payment
100	Payments to Private Providers
200	Payments to Public Providers
300	Medicare Buy-Ins and Supplements
400	Uncompensated Care Costs

LDH allocates appropriated revenues and expenditures within each of the four programs. Revenues and expenditures at a program level are bound by the limits in HB 1. Sub-program allocations are at the discretion of LDH. Initial allocations and final actuals may vary.

Act 119 requires LDH to provide on a routine basis to the Joint Legislative Committee on Budget (JLCB) detailed financial information on the Medical Vendor Payments agency, specifically:

By October 1, for the previous fiscal year:

- An itemization of actual revenues and expenditures;
- An itemization of actual supplemental and uncompensated care costs payments to the LSU Public Private Partnership hospitals;

By October 1, for the current fiscal year:

- An initial allocation of expenditures within each of the four programs;

Monthly thereafter, for the current fiscal year:

- Projected expenditures within each of the four programs;
- An itemization of projected supplemental and uncompensated care costs payments to the LSU Public Private Partnership hospitals;
- The total amount of pharmacy rebates received year-to-date and the total amount projected to be received by the end of the fiscal year.
- Projected revenue collections by source.

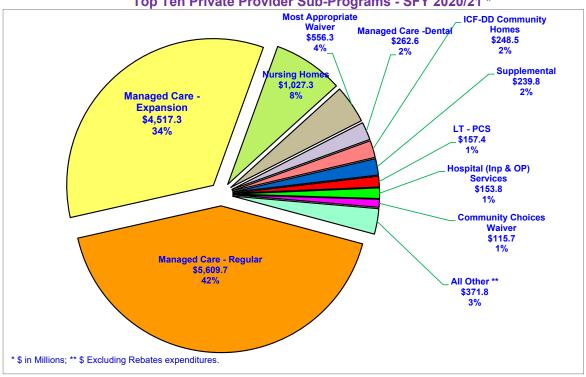
